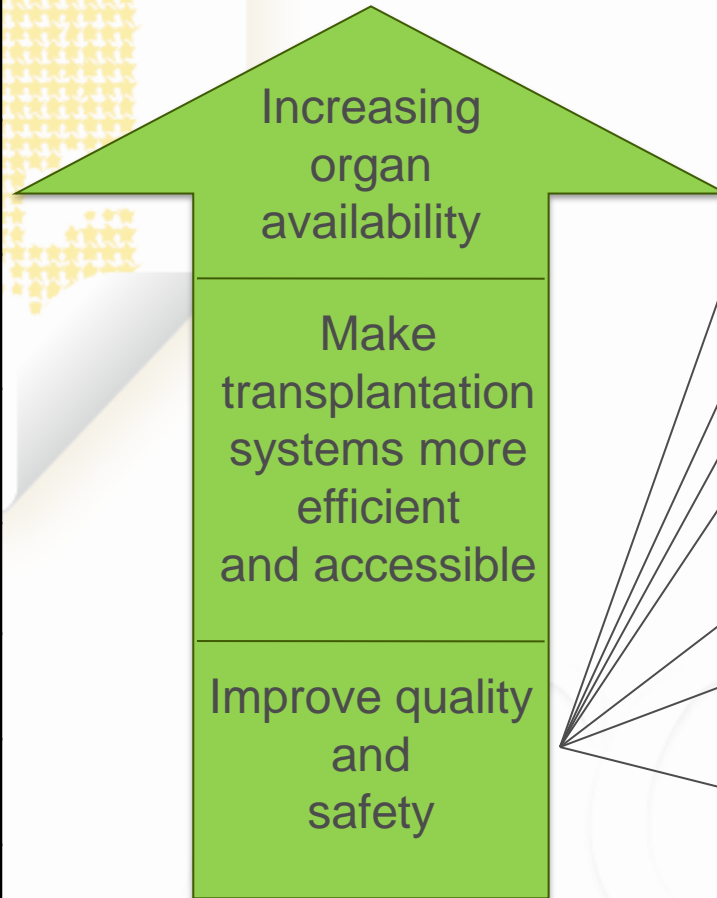

DIRECTIVE 2010/53/EU

Priority action 1: Promote the role of DTC in every hospital where there is a potential for organ donation
Priority action 2: Promote Quality Improvement Programmes in every hospital where there is a potential for organ donation
Priority Action 3 : Exchange of best practices on organ living donation programmes among EU Member States: Support registries of living donors
Priority Action 4: Improve knowledge and communication skills of health professionals and patients support groups on organ transplantation

ACCORD - Joint Action co-funded by the European Commission

Aim

ACCORD intends to strengthen the full potential of Member States in the field of organ donation and transplantation, improving the cooperation between them and contributing to the effective implementation of the *EU Directive 2010/53/EU* and the *Action Plan on Organ Donation and Transplantation (2009-2015): Strengthened Cooperation between MS.*



ACCORD Objectives

1. To improve MS information systems on living organ donation through the provision of recommendations for the design and management of structured registries and through setting down a model for supranational data sharing
2. To facilitate the cooperation between critical care professionals and donor transplant coordinators, to optimize the realization of donation from the deceased
3. To implement practical collaborations (twinnings) between EU countries for the transfer of knowledge, expertise or tools in specific areas related to the *Directive 2010/53/EU* and the *Action Plan on Organ Donation and Transplantation (2009-2015)*, based on comprehensive and specifically prepared protocols
